The EDT (Engineering Development Trust) is the largest provider of STEM (science, technology, engineering and mathematics) enrichment activities for UK youth. They run a scheme called the 'Year in Industry', paid career development work placements for students completing A levels/Scottish Highers/equivalent qualifications or as part of a university sandwich career.

The Tewkesbury Software department has been involved with the Year in Industry scheme since 2008 (following on from a successful 6 month internship from ENSEA in 2007), taking on undergraduate students for a year who have had 2 years university education.

The Halliburton job title for student is called a Co-op (Job title: X035-ESG Co-op), which is an American term for a sandwich student.

Semir Ibrahim has been employed to develop production test software for the tri-axial magnetometer which is used in high temperature MWD tools on exploration jobs

As part of the Year in Industry scheme, students are able to enrol for free in a CMI course (normally costing a few thousand pounds). The Chartered Management Institute (CMI) is a professional institution for managers. Semir achieved that highest grade in the CMI assessment out of the 90 YINI students in Gloucestershire (some of the students are at Oxbridge).
